Call for Nominations

2010 Science Teacher Mentoring Award



These awards recognize junior and senior high school science teachers who have found creative ways to nurture students' interest in scientific inquiry and promote science education in their schools. The award criteria specifically considers the nominees' support of students' hands-on projects and experiences outside the classroom that generate interest in the fields of science, technology, engineering and math (STEM). There are two award categories – one for teachers with 1 to 10 years of experience, and another for teachers with 11 or more years of experience.

Award recipients receive \$1,000 and a commemorative plaque. The teachers' schools also receive \$1,000 and a plaque for their trophy case.

- Please include any other details about the nominee and how she/he inspires students to learn and grow.
